



Sociology and Social Work Review Copyright Policy

Sociology and Social Work Review (SSWR) author rights

Authors sign a license agreement, where authors maintain the articles copyright and retain publishing rights without restrictions, but grant broad publishing and distribution rights to the publisher, including the right to publish the article on SSWR's online platform (according to Creative Commons user licenses CC BY-SA 4.0¹). In this case authors have the right to:

1. Use the article for Personal Use (maintaining their Personal Use rights):
 - Distribution of copies (through e-mail or online platforms) to research colleagues, academic environment, education etc.
 - Inclusion in a thesis or dissertation (as long as it contains a clear reference to the article published by the SSWR).
 - Extending the article to book-length form (as long as it contains a clear reference to the article published by the SSWR).
 - Use in a future compilation of the author's works (as long as it contains a clear reference to the article published by the SSWR).
 - Preparation of other derivate works
 - Otherwise using or re-using portions or excerpts works
2. Share their article in the same ways permitted to third parties under the relevant user license (together with Personal Use rights) as long as it contains a clear reference to the article published by the SSWR.
3. Retain patent, trademark and other intellectual property rights (including research data).
4. Proper attribution and credit for the published work.
